EACH ANIMATED GRAPHIC COUNTDOWN AND CRAWL ORGINATED FROM OUR HUB MASTERCONTROL. IT INCLUDED ALL REQUIRED INFORMATION WITHIN THE ANIMATION INCLUDING WEBSITE AND PHONE NUMBER FOR MORE INFORMATION.

Mandatory Daily Notices - Last Quarter

These notices must be aired for no fewer than 15 seconds each, at least once per day, between 8 a.m. and 11:35 p.m., and at least three times per week between 8 p.m. and 11 p.m. in the Atlantic, Eastern and Pacific time zones, and between 7 p.m. and 10 p.m. in the Mountain, Central, and Alaskan time zones, until the station terminates analog programming. Stations may choose alternative on-air methods to comply with these notice requirements, but if so they may not be counted toward the transition PSA/transition CST obligations.
